


Pandemic Response Team meetings, department and faculty meetings, and administrative team meetings continue to take place on a consistent basis.

- Much better than remote instruction in the spring
- Somewhat better than remote instruction in the spring

Establishing relationships with students is the most positive aspect of reopening.

Planning for both virtual and in-person instruction is most challenging (time, technology).

Most open-ended comments recommended continuation of the current schedule:

- Routines were being established.
- Safety was being maintained.
- Adding lunch would not be worth the risk/benefit.



- 0% Satisfaction rating of 1 or 2 (dissatisfied or very dissatisfied)



- 5% Satisfaction rating of 1 or 2 (dissatisfied or very dissatisfied)






Kindergarten - Grade 5 Parents

A/B Rotation or Consistent Days

- 44% would prefer to switch to consistent days with one rotating day per week.
- 37% prefer to continue with current A/B Rotation with each day of the month assigned.



- I prefer to keep current A/B rotation.
- I prefer consistent days each week with one rotating day.
- N/A; my child will remain in the remoteonly model regardless of the proposed changes.

Consistent Days for Elementary Only - Keeping Families Together

- 278 (12.4%) can not have their children in different schools attend in-person instruction on different days of the week
- 347 (15%) *can* work with this scenario
- Question not applicable to 72% (only have elementary children or children are remote)


Continuation of Current Model

97% will keep their children in the same model.






Lunch in School

Are you comfortable with your child having lunch in the school, with appropriate social distancing and cleaning protocols, either in the classroom, or in the cafeteria? If the instructional in-person day is longer in Phase 2, the live virtual contact with teachers (including specialists) on the at-home day will not be possible. In the hybrid instructional model, are you in favor of a longer in-person school day, with lunch, knowing there will be no live teacher contact on the at-home day?



If the district moves to a longer in-person school day that would include lunch are you likely to request that your child transition from one model of instruction to another?

K-5 Considerations based on the Data

- Switching the A/B rotation is favored 44% to 37%, but would negatively impact a large number of families.
- Adding lunch and a longer day has significant safety, staffing, and scheduling implications. Is the risk/benefit advantageous when weighing all the factors?
- Special education students are struggling with both instructional models.
- Open-ended feedback about the at-home day indicates improvements can be made.



Current Recommendations based on the Data (K-5)


- Bring all elementary special education students to the buildings for in-person instruction five days per week. Deliver appropriate instruction daily and use large spaces staffed by aides to provide support starting on October 26.
- Enhance instruction on the at-home day in the hybrid model by integrating live streaming. Additional monitors have been purchased and the PD Day for elementary teachers will focus on training with live streaming and additional technology tools.
- Open the playgrounds for scheduled time slots with proper cleaning protocols and mask-wearing.
- We will continue to consider the risk-benefit of going to full day.


Similar to elementary teachers, 6-12 staff indicated that establishing relationships with students was the most positive aspect of reopening, while planning for all classes/models has been most challenging.

- 5% Satisfaction rating of 1 or 2 (dissatisfied or very dissatisfied)







Lunch in School

If it is possible to extend the school day, are you comfortable with your child having lunch in school with appropriate social distancing and cleaning protocols in place for Phase 2? Half the students would eat lunch socially distanced in the cafeteria, half socially distanced in the gym. Both spaces would be at approximately 25% capacity of the space. Students would have assigned seats, and masks would be removed while students are eating. In addition, students would be given outdoor recess time (weather permitting) with masks being worn during the lunch period once they have finished eating their lunches.






Grades 6 - 8 Students (BF)




67% Satisfaction rating of 4 or 5 (satisfied or very satisfied)






Grades 6 - 8 Students (GW)

175 responses




66% Satisfaction rating of 4 or 5 (satisfied or very satisfied)





Parent Satisfaction with Phase 1 Experience


- 1,356 High School Parent Responses






