- ▶ Parents only get to pay the bill





Four Year Colleges and Programs for LD/ADD students

- Structured/Proactive Programs:
 - These programs' services go *well* beyond those that are legally mandated and the student is provided with a more structured environment that includes low staff/student ratios. They usually have special admissions requirements.



Four Year Colleges and Programs for LD/ADD students

- Self-Directed/Decentralized Programs:

- Usually don't have separate admissions processes and eligibility for services must be established by the provision of disability documentation that meets institutional standards.
